Delivering Education in Paediatric Palliative Care

Improving the quality of palliative care provided to children and young people close to their home through education and research throughout Australia.

Paediatric Palliative Care enhances the quality of life for children and young people with life limiting conditions, while supporting the child's entire family. Supports available to families and local health professionals include pain and symptom management, practical support (eg. equipment needs), care co-ordination, emotional and spiritual support and after-hours telephone support.

The QuoCCA project delivers paediatric palliative care education to health professionals in metropolitan, rural, regional and remote areas of Australia who may care for children and young people with palliative and end-of-life care needs.

This is achieved through:

- Pop-up education and providing support to health professionals in their own communities caring for children with life limiting conditions, and their families.
- Various styles of education sessions facilitated by interprofessional paediatric palliative care specialists covering all topics relevant to health professionals through scheduled education sessions and ongoing online access to educational learning modules.
- Supporting primary care providers caring for paediatric patients with life limiting conditions and their families throughout their journey.



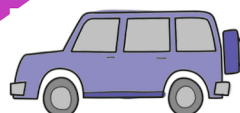
